

Sen. Kirk A. Cullimore was elected to the Utah Senate in 2018 and represents District 19, the southeast part of Salt Lake County and sections of northeast Utah County. He currently serves as the Senate Majority Leader.

Sen. Cullimore received an associate degree in music from Utah Valley University. He then served a two-year mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in the Philippines. After returning, he received a bachelor's degree in music from Brigham Young University and spent six years teaching music and managing a music studio. Sen. Cullimore then earned his law degree from the University of Oklahoma and primarily practiced Federal Indian Law there before returning to Utah, where he now runs his own firm specializing in business law, land use, water development and technology issues.

In his spare time, Sen. Cullimore volunteers as chairman of the board for the Intermountain Suzuki String Institute and serves on the boards of the Suzuki Association of America and Salt Lake Regional Medical Center. He's a member of the Utah Valley University Alumni Association, previously co-chaired the Brookwood Elementary School Community Council and served as the government affairs chair for the Utah Apartment Association. Additionally, Sen. Cullimore enjoys being an accompanist for an elementary school choir.

Sen. Cullimore and his wife, Heather, live in Sandy, with their six children. They stay busy attending their kids' activities, including violin, cello, dance and soccer.
