

Sen. F. Ann Millner represents District 5, covering parts of Davis, Morgan and Weber counties. Elected to the Utah Senate in 2015, she chairs the Economic Development and Workforce Services Committee, the Higher Education Appropriations Subcommittee, the School Security Task Force and the Senate Ethics Committee.

Sen. Millner is a champion of preparing a strong workforce, improving public and higher education, bolstering economic growth and Utah's strategic industry clusters and planning for the state's long-term needs in energy abundance and critical minerals accessibility.

She also serves on several national education and policy boards, including the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL) Foundation Board of Directors and Executive Committee, the Education Commission of the States (ECS) Commission, the ExcelinEd Policy Leaders Network and the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE) Commission, where she was recently elected Chair for 2026.

Born in Middlesboro, Kentucky, and raised in Tennessee, Sen. Millner earned her bachelor's degree in education from the University of Tennessee, her master's from Southwest Texas State University and her doctorate from Brigham Young University. She served as a regents professor of health administration and was president of Weber State University from 2002 to 2012.

Sen. Millner's legislative work has focused on workforce preparation, public and higher education, aerospace defense industries and healthcare access.
