

Sen. Keven Stratton represents District 24, covering parts of Utah and Wasatch counties. He was appointed to the Utah House of Representatives in 2012 and joined the Senate in 2025. He is the co-chair of the Social Services Appropriations Subcommittee and the Federalism Commission and serves on the Senate Rules Committee, the Senate Health and Human Services Committee, the Senate Natural Resources, Agriculture and Environment Committee, the Transportation and Infrastructure Appropriations Subcommittee and the Legislative Water Commission.

Sen. Stratton earned his bachelor's degree in finance and his J.D. from the J. Reuben Clark Law School, both at Brigham Young University. He is an attorney and farmer who owns and operates a group of companies in construction, agriculture, manufacturing, real estate and law, employing over 250 people.

He has served in numerous community leadership roles, including chair of the Provo-Orem Chamber of Commerce, Healthy Utah Valley and Kids on the Move, as well as advisory board member of the Utah Consumer Protection Agency. He has been recognized as Outstanding Businessman of the Year by the Utah State Chamber of Commerce and Outstanding Citizen of the Year by Senator Arthur V. Watkins.

Sen. Stratton and his wife, Laurie, live in Orem and have eight children and 21 grandchildren.
