

Sen. Evan Vickers represents District 28, covering Beaver, Iron, Juab, Millard and Washington counties. He was first elected to public office in 1987, serving on the Cedar City Council until 1999. In 2009, he was elected to the Utah House of Representatives and joined the Senate in 2012. He served as Senate majority leader from 2019 to 2025 and currently chairs the Senate Business and Labor Committee, where he has focused on small business regulation and rural Utah issues.

Born in Panguitch and raised in Beaver, Sen. Vickers graduated from the University of Utah College of Pharmacy in 1977. He and his family own six businesses, five in Cedar City and one in Richfield.

Sen. Vickers and his wife, Chris, have five children, 15 grandchildren, one great-grandchild and live in Cedar City. In his free time, he enjoys golfing, hunting and fishing at their family cabin near Panguitch.
